

Past Simple

We use Past Simple to talk about events that happened in the past:

AFFIRMATIVE

I	walked
You	walked
He	walked
She	walked
It	walked
We	walked
You	walked
They	walked

NEGATIVE

I	didn't	walk
You	didn't	walk
He	didn't	walk
She	didn't	walk
It	didn't	walk
We	didn't	walk
You	didn't	walk
They	didn't	walk

QUESTION

Did	I	walk?
Did	You	walk?
Did	He	walk?
Did	She	walk?
Did	It	walk?
Did	We	walk?
Did	You	walk?
Did	They	walk?

There are 2 types of verbs:

- **Regular:** the past form of regular verbs is made adding -ed (or -d)
- **Irregular:** each irregular verb is different so we **must** learn them.

To make NEGATIVE sentences we add the auxiliary verb **DID** (verb **DO** in **PAST**) and the word **NOT** (didn't) **except** for the verb **TO BE** (we only add the word **NOT** > I was an actor/ I was **NOT** an actor).

As you can see, there is no S for 3rd person singular (He, She, It) .

To make INTERROGATIVE sentences we also use **DID** and we change the order of the words: **DID + SUBJECT + MAIN VERB + ?**

MUST REMEMBER !!

To make a sentence using the verb **TO BE** (and other irregular verbs) you have to learn it:

I WAS/ WASN'T

YOU WERE/ WEREN'T

HE WAS/ WASN'T

SHE WAS/ WASN'T

IT WAS/ WASN'T

YOU WERE/ WEREN'T

WE WERE/ WEREN'T

THEY WERE/ WEREN'T
