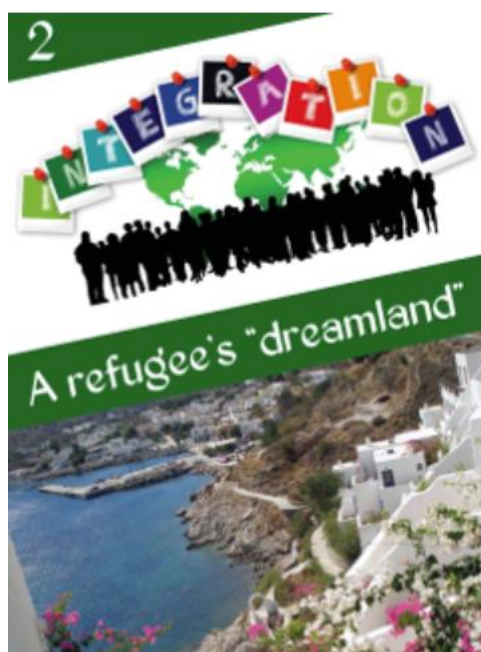

Glossary:

refer to = to mention something

accommodation = a place for someone to stay, live, or work

health care = the services that are provided for looking after people's health, or the activity of doing this

illegally = in a way that is contrary to or forbidden by law

go ashore = on/towards the shore of a lake, river, sea etc.

casualty = someone who is hurt or killed in an accident or war

treat = behave towards somebody/something

the authorities = the people or organizations that are in charge of a particular country or area

consequence = something that happens as a result of a particular action or set of conditions

active citizen = a person who actively takes responsibility and initiative in areas of public concern such as crime prevention and the local community.
